

## **NET News Providing Coverage of Election Issues**

LINCOLN, Neb. (April 28, 2010) – NET News has launched a comprehensive election coverage web page which will offer voters a one-stop shop for information on major statewide races and significant local ballot issues. NET News will produce a series of reports leading up to the primary on Tuesday, May 11. The stories will air during NET Radio's Morning Edition and All Things Considered and will be archived at [netNebraska.org/campaign2010](http://netNebraska.org/campaign2010).

Beginning Monday, May 3, on NET Radio, NET News reporters will be offering stories on a variety of topics including a four-part series on Lincoln's proposed Haymarket arena project; Amendment 1 (which would allow local governments to issue bonds to buy or develop property for use by nonprofit organizations); the contested primary race for Governor; the primary runoff for State Treasurer and reports on the Congressional primary races. These NET News reports will run at various times during Nebraska news segments in Morning Edition at 6:04, 6:35, 7:04, 8:04 and 8:35 a.m. and in All Things Considered at 4:30, 4:45, and 5:30 p.m.

Coverage of major races and candidates will continue over the summer and fall. The Campaign Connection 2010 website will include an on-line voter guide along with short videos where candidates will answer issue-oriented questions.
