

## **"Smart Investing" on NET Radio on Aug. 6 and 9 Focuses on Investment Fraud**

LINCOLN, Neb. (July 25, 2008) -- "Smart Investing" on NET Radio continues its series with a report on investment fraud airing Wednesday, Aug. 6, at 4:45 p.m. CT during "All Things Considered." It will repeat Saturday, Aug. 9, at 3:35 p.m. CT during "Marketplace Money."

NET Radio reporter Clay Masters talks with Tom Sindelar with the Nebraska Department of Banking and Finance who specializes in investment fraud cases for the state. Sindelar describes how fraud has changed over the years, who is most at risk and how to get out of a fraud scheme once a person is already involved.

"Smart Investing" reports offer information on investor protection at all stages of life. Topics covered in the series include investment education and guidance, investment fraud and the myriad of investment choices available to Nebraskans. Segments air at least once each week during "Morning Edition," "All Things Considered," Saturday's "Marketplace Money" and "Weekend America." The radio reports are part of a project that will also include a live call-in show with investment expert Chris Farrell on NET Radio and television specials later in the year from NET Television.
