

## **NET Radio's "Nebraska Concerts" in September Offers A Variety of Classical Music**

LINCOLN, Neb. (Aug. 25, 2010) -- In September "Nebraska Concerts," NET Radio's weekly series of fine music performed and recorded on Nebraska's stages, begins the 2010-2011 season with music performed by the Omaha Symphony, the Abendmusik Chorus and University Singers with the Abendmusik Orchestra, Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra and Chatham Baroque. "Nebraska Concerts" airs on NET Radio Sundays at 1 p.m. CT.

On Sunday, Sept. 5, "Nebraska Concerts" presents a program from an Omaha Symphony Chamber Series concert entitled "Mozart and Salieri." The orchestra performs Mozart's "Symphony No. 25 in G Minor, K. 183," "Serenade in G, K. 525, 'Eine Kleine Nachtmusik,'" "Overture to 'Le Nozze di Figaro,' K. 492," and "Symphony No. 39 in E-flat Major, K. 543." Thomas Wilkins is the conductor for this 2008-2009 season finale.

The next program, airing Sunday, Sept. 12, is from an Abendmusik: Lincoln concert with the Abendmusik Chorus, University Singers and Abendmusik Orchestra performing Brahms monumental "German Requiem." Tom Trenney conducts Abendmusik's own choral group and the University Singers from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Lincoln's Symphony Orchestra took part in this year's American Liszt Society Spring Festival at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. On Sunday, Sept. 19, listeners will hear a concert they performed during the festival called "Liszt at the Lied," with three guest pianists at the Lied Center for Performing Arts. Conductor Edward Polochick leads the orchestra in performances of: Schumann's "Piano Concerto in A Minor, Op.54" with Gila Goldstein; Chopin's "Piano Concerto No. 2 in F Minor, Op. 21" with Alexandre Dossin; and, Liszt's "Piano Concerto No. 1 in E-flat Major, S. 124," with Arnaldo Cohen.

The last program of the month on Sunday, Sept. 26, comes from the early music ensemble Chatham Baroque, performing a concert entitled "Alchemy for Three." The Pennsylvania-based trio performs on period instruments and includes Andrew Fouts, baroque violin; Patricia Halverson, viola de gamba; and Scott Pauley, theorbo and baroque guitar. They play music from the Baroque period by Dario Castello, Philipp Heinrich Erlebach, Bach, Francesco Maria Veracini, Dietrich Buxtehude, Giovanni Girolamo Kapsberger, Arcangelo Corelli, and Nicola Matteis.

"Nebraska Concerts" is broadcast on NET Radio, a service of NET. Dave Hughes is producer; Genevieve Randall is scriptwriter and host. The Omaha Symphony concert was recorded by Clete Baker of Studio B for Classical 90.7, KVNO.
