

NET Radio Offers Call-In Show on H1N1 Virus in Nebraska

LINCOLN, Neb. (Sept. 3, 2009) -- Cases of the new H1N1 flu are on the rise in Nebraska. NET Radio is airing a live call-in show about the new virus and its potential impact on Nebraska. Health experts will answer called-in questions about prevention, vaccination and other concerns. The program will be broadcast Tuesday, Sept. 8, at 6:30 p.m. CT.

Experts on the one-hour show will be Dr. Joann Schaefer, Chief Medical Officer, Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services; Dr. Dennis Hughes, State Veterinarian, Nebraska Department of Agriculture; and Dr. Derrick Anderson, a family practice physician with Southwest Family Health in Lincoln. NET Radio's Sarah McCammon will host the program.
