

NET Radio's "Nebraska Concerts" Breezes into Autumn with the Nebraska Brass, the Chiara String Quartet and More in October

LINCOLN, Neb. (Sept. 28, 2011) -- In October, NET Radio's "Nebraska Concerts" brings listeners music by the Omaha Symphony Chamber Orchestra, the Castalia Trio, the Chiara String Quartet, the Nebraska Brass, the Bottom Line Duo and more. "Nebraska Concerts" airs on NET Radio on Sundays at 1 p.m. CT.

On Sunday, Oct. 2, the Omaha Symphony, under the direction of conductor and music director Thomas Wilkins, performs a concert entitled "Flute Showcase," featuring Sergei Prokofiev's "Symphony No. 1," Carl Nielsen's "Concerto for Flute and Orchestra" with flutist Maria Harding and Beethoven's "Symphony No. 2."

"Nebraska Concerts" continues on Sunday, Oct. 9, with the Castalia Trio performing three piano trios as part of a Sheldon Friends of Chamber Music series concert in Lincoln. The group performs Franz Schubert's "Piano Trio No. 2 in E Flat Major, D. 929;" Robert Muczynski's "Piano Trio No. 3, Op. 46;" and Maurice Ravel's "Piano Trio."

On Sunday, Oct. 16, the Chiara String Quartet performs three Beethoven quartets: "String Quartet in B Flat Major, Op. 18, No. 6;" "String Quartet in B Flat Major, Op. 130;" and, "Grosse Fuge in B Flat Major, Op. 133."

On Sunday, Oct. 23, "Nebraska Concerts" takes a hiatus for the NET Radio Fall Membership Drive. In its place NET Radio will air a special episode of "A Prairie Home Companion."

As summer memories fade to fall and winter, the final October "Nebraska Concerts," airing Sunday, Oct. 30, features the Nebraska Brass performing a program entitled "Summertime." Also included in this program is a concert from Lincoln's Arts for the Soul series, featuring husband and wife Spencer and Traci Hoveskeland of the Bottom Line Duo performing classical and popular works for cello and bass.

"Nebraska Concerts" is broadcast on NET Radio, a service of NET. Dave Hughes is producer; Genevieve Randall is scriptwriter and host. The Omaha Symphony concert was recorded by Clete Baker of Studio B for Classical 90.7, KVNO.
