

## **NET Radio Interviews "History Detective" Gwendolyn Wright**

LINCOLN, Neb. (Oct. 26, 2009) -- Is the 20th century's most famous architect responsible for suburban sprawl? Gwendolyn Wright, a professor, author and one of PBS's "History Detectives," answers that question and others in an interview with NET Radio's Jerry Johnston that will air during NET Radio's "Weekend Edition" Saturday, Oct. 31, at 8:30 a.m. CT, repeating Sunday, Nov. 1, at 9:30 a.m. CT.

Johnston spoke with Wright prior to her lecture on "Frank Lloyd Wright's Progressive Suburbia" in Lincoln on Nov. 2, as part of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's Geske lecture series. Gwendolyn Wright is Professor of Architecture at Columbia University and also holds appointments in Columbia's departments of history and art history. She is the author of six books, scores of articles and has won academic awards including a Getty Fellowship and Guggenheim Fellowship. Since 2003 Professor Wright has also served as a host of the popular PBS television series "History Detectives," which airs on NET Television Sundays at 6 p.m. CT.
