

## State's People, Places & Events Featured on "Nebraska Stories"

LINCOLN, Neb. (Nov. 4, 2009) -- Compelling, personal tales of Nebraskans and Nebraska life, both contemporary and historical, are featured in NET Television's monthly series "Nebraska Stories," airing Monday, Nov. 16, at 9 p.m. CT on NET1 and NET-HD.

Comprised of several segments, the half-hour program will follow a group of Nebraska World War II veterans who are reunited at the WWII Memorial in Washington, D.C., as well as offer a look at the 1930s Dust Bowl in Nebraska.

Other segments examine the story of a 19th century Ponca infant buried in Neligh's Laurel Hill cemetery; a potluck Thanksgiving dinner at the Burr Oak school; and a University of Nebraska-Lincoln music professor who travels across the state performing in rural communities with a grand piano in tow.

"Nebraska Stories" will repeat several times on NET1 and NET-HD, including Wednesday, Nov. 18, at 11:30 p.m. CT; Saturday, Nov. 21, at 7:30 p.m. CT; Sunday, Nov. 22, at 11:30 p.m. CT; Sunday, Nov. 29, at 11:30 p.m. CT; and Monday, Nov. 30, at 11:30 p.m. CT. It will also air on NET2 on Tuesday, Nov. 17, at 8 p.m. CT and Monday, Nov. 23, at 7:30 p.m. CT.
